Vietnam & Cambodia | October 19-27, 2017 (Angkor Wat extension | October 27-29, 2017)



The Greater Mekong region holds irreplaceable riches—ranging from rare wildlife in spectacular natural landscapes to communities with distinct cultural heritages. Winding almost 3,000 miles from the Tibetan plateau down to the South China Sea, the Mekong River boasts the world's largest inland fishery and is second only to the Amazon River in terms of fish biodiversity. However, unprecedented social and economic development in the region makes conservation work

here especially urgent and crucial. Join Stuart Chapman and local WWF experts to gain insight into the lives of the people who depend on the river for their way of life, the wildlife that rely on its waters, and the ways WWF is helping protect its future.

- VisitTram Chim National Park, one of Vietnam's most important remaining expanses of wetlands, where WWF has taken a unique approach to preserving and restoring the park's natural state.
- In Phnom Penh, Cambodia's bustling capital, visit WWF's office and discover its rich French colonial past and cultural sites
- Explore Tonle Sap Lake. Designated as a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve in 1997, it is the richest freshwater fishing grounds in the world and home to entire floating villages.
- Cruise in comfort aboard the newly launched 205-foot Aqua Mekong, with options to pedal and paddle portions of the trip.
- Join the optional Siem Reap/Angkor Wat extension to marvel at the sprawling complex of ancient temples, the most exquisite example of ancient Khmer architecture in Southeast Asia.

ITINERARY

Day 1, October 19: Arrive Saigon, Vietnam Upon arrival in Saigon (also known as Ho Chi Minh City), you will transfer to the Park Hyatt Saigon for an overnight

stay. This evening we will enjoy a celebratory welcome dinner in order to launch your journey and meet your fellow travelers.

Day 2, October 20: Saigon/Mekong River

This afternoon we will depart for My Tho dock. Upon arrival, we will

board the Aqua Mekong for our seven-night cruise.
Settle into your elegantly appointed river-facing room to enjoy one of life's most memorable and photogenic adventures.
Over the coming days, we sail from here along the Mekong, one of the world's great rivers, towards remote natural and cultural destinations visited by only a few—and into the heart of WWF's work in the region.

Day 3-8, October 21-26: Mekong River/Tonle Sap Lake
Over the next several days we will
wind our way through the Mekong's
southern delta. The Mekong river
will take us into the fascinating yet
less-visited world along one of Asia's
great waterways. Before crossing into
Cambodia we'll visit Tram Chim
National Park, one of the most important
remaining expanses of wetlands in
Vietnam, where WWF is working to
restore natural water flows, fisheries

and wildlife. In Phnom Penh, Cambodia's bustling capital, we'll visit cultural sites and WWF's office before continuing on to Tonle Sap Lake. Designated as a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve in 1997, Tonle Sap Lake is home to entire floating villages and the richest freshwater fishing grounds in the world. Along the way we will experience remote villages, lively markets, ancient temples, verdant plantations and stunning river landscapes. Evenings will be spent learning

more about the region with thoughtful discussions from Stuart Chapman and local WWF experts.

Overnight Aqua Mekong (B,L,D)

Day 9, October 27: Tonle Sap Lake/Siem Reap Early today we will be joined by a local WWF representative as we set off by skiff into the Prek Toal Core Bird Reserve, one of the largest bodies of freshwater in Asia. This afternoon, say your goodbyes and disembark



from the Aqua Mekong and transfer to Siem Reap. Upon arrival you will be transferred to the airport for your international departure or join the optional Angkor Wat extension to marvel at the sprawling complex of ancient temples.




