Best Practices

Keep these best practices in mind throughout the FIP launch stage:

- Prior to the stakeholder meeting to develop the FIP workplan, it is recommended that smaller meetings be held with government and industry groups to prepare them for the larger meeting and explain the goals and expected outcomes.
- Ensure a broad cross-section of stakeholders participate in the meeting to develop the FIP workplan.
- Hire a FIP Consultant, if needed, to ensure identified actions meet the FIP's objectives, and to help facilitate the meeting.
- Conduct the stakeholder meeting to develop the FIP workplan in the local language.
- Manage expectations. It takes time to finalize the workplan.
- In the workplan, include tasks for each action to help track progress.
- It is recommended to share the final FIP workplan with stakeholders and post the FIP publicly on FisheryProgress.org once the workplan is finalized.
